VILLAGE EQUESTRIAN NEWS

The Equestrian Commission met on the 19th of August to discuss the continued need for the Equestrian Trail Licenses issued by the Village for the purpose of riding on the Village deeded easement trails.

By Ordinance in June in 2005, certain trails traversing private land in the Village exist as easements recorded in favor of the Village. The easements are generally in and around the newer subdivisions in the Village where the Village and the Equestrian Commission worked successfully with developers subdividing tracts of land to protect the continuity of the trail network and to maintain the unique character of the Village. Easement trails are maintained by the RCBH. As set forth in Title 6 and Section 8-5 of the Village Code, equestrian use of easement trails is allowed solely by licenses issued by the Village of Barrington Hills.

There is an ongoing discussion with a need for further information. As soon as the Equestrian Commission has that information a date will be determined for the next meeting.

STATE OF THE TRAILS

We have only had to mow the trails twice this year as it has been a dry summer, however, there were many trees down which made it a little tricky for Steve Gregory who has been mowing the trails for us for many years. So far, we have spent around half of our budget, but there is a lot of trimming left to do.





The challenge we are facing at the moment is the area north of the Riding Center and south of Lake Cook Road. It has become very swampy and is dangerous to ride through, which is why the trails in that area have not been mowed. We met with the Forest Preserves of Cook County and they are looking into ways to make the trails accessible and to give them access to the area to do conservation work. In the meantime, the RCBH is looking at ways to reroute the trails so we can connect the northwest and southwest sectors to ride to the Riding Center and the trails behind it.

WALK ONLY TRAIL RIDES

Walk only trail rides are scheduled every Saturday when possible to help familiarize RCBH members with the trail system and are a great time for members to meet each other and socialize. It also allows the horses to become more comfortable riding in groups in a low pressure, friendly atmosphere.
